GLAZIER APPRENTICESHIP ANNOUNCEMENT CONTINUED

DESCRIPTION OF WORK:

GLAZIER: A Glazier does the measuring, handling, cutting, preparation, edging, installation, removal, repair, replacement and sealing of all types of glass, mirrors, and glass substitutes as well as the layout, preparation, fabrication, installation, removal, repair, replacement and sealing of all architectural metal products including: storefront and all related systems: aluminum/ glass entrances and entrance ways, window and solar panel systems, curtainwall systems and all components thereof, skylights and all sloped glazing applications.

WORK PROCESSES:

Approximately 8,000 hours (4 years) of on-the-job training is required for completion of the apprenticeship program. The work processes include:

Glass Cutting	250 Hours	Doors & Hardware	750 Hours
Caulking	1000 Hours	Fabrication	2000 Hours
Installing Framing	2000 Hours	Installing Glass	2000 Hours

REQUIRED RELATED TRAINING:

- DOL Certified OSHA 30 outreach course during first year (www.advanceonline.com)
- Approximately 144 Hours of related training is required each year, training includes: Materials, Mathematics, Blueprint Reading, Tools, Economics, Equipment Science, Layout, Welding, Occupational Accident Prevention, History, First Aid, Hoisting & Rigging, Labor Law, Property Damage, Information Related to Other Trades and Rules & Regulations governing the manufacture and/or use of glass and glazing materials. **NOTE:** Tuition is paid by the program; a Scholarship Loan Agreement must be signed.

WAGE SCHEDULE

The average wage for Journeymen employed by the participating employers in the occupation is \$53.15 per hour (effective 7/1/2025). The progressive wage rate to be paid the apprentice is:

1 st Period	1,000 Hours	45%	\$47.48 total pkg (\$23.92 wage + \$23.56 benefits)
2 nd Period	1,000 Hours	55%	\$52.79 total pkg (\$29.23 wage + \$23.56 benefits)
3 rd Period	1,000 Hours	65%	\$58.11 total pkg (\$34.55 wage + \$23.56 benefits)
4 th Period	1,000 Hours	75%	\$63.42 total pkg (\$39.86 wage + \$23.56 benefits)
5 th Period	1,000 Hours	80%	\$66.08 total pkg (\$42.52 wage + \$23.56 benefits)
6 th Period	1,000 Hours	85%	\$68.74 total pkg (\$45.18 wage + \$23.56 benefits)
7 th Period	1,000 Hours	90%	\$71.40 total pkg (\$47.84 wage + \$23.56 benefits)
8 th Period	1,000 Hours	95%	\$74.05 total pkg (\$50.49 wage + \$23.56 benefits)

NOTE: Selection from the pool of eligible applicants will be by ranking based on interview scores and point system. Points are awarded based on written information provided by the applicant, such as high school transcripts, other educational documentation and letters of reference.
